Sandwell Safeguarding Adults Board Annual Conference 2017







The annual SSAB Prevention Sub Group conference took place on 11 October 2017 at Brasshouse Community Centre. The day was hugely successful with around 100 delegates attending. The day focused on criteria for Adult Safeguarding referrals and included some fabulous presentations. Councillor Anne Shackleton opened the event followed by Elaine Kingston from IRIS Drug Services and Chair of the Prevention Sub Group and Sara Ward from Black Country Woment's Aid and Chair of the Quality and Excellence Group outlining the issues around referrals and the work of the sub groups. Michelle Moore from the SSAB Business Team gave a great presentation on the Mental Capacity Act which was very well received as was Nick Law from Public Health's talk around the Sandwell Hub and pathways into this. Paul from IRIS Drug Services gave a very emotional recovery story (not a dry eye in the house) followed by Tracey Hubble from Sandwell Enquiry outlining the huge amount of services accessed via Sandwell Enquiry. Delegates worked in groups looking at case studies and options available for sign posting if not appropriate for a Safeguarding referral. Feedback was really positive highlighting the delivery of new information and the need for more events where third sector can work with the local authority.
